

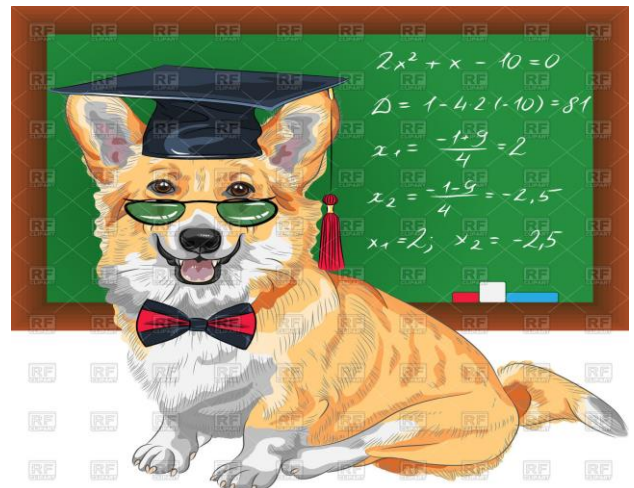

LOGISTICS

1. If you are writing, ensure that you are at school by 7h30.

EXAM RULES

You must use your own stationery (2 blue pens, 2 HB pencils, eraser, sharpener, stapler, staples and ruler). No bags or pencil cases are allowed. You must use a transparent bag.

Make sure you have all you need for the subject you writing e.g. calculator, protractor, etc.

No tip-ex is allowed.

Once in the exam venue:

- You may not talk.
- You may not eat or drink.
- You may not walk around.
- You may not go to the toilet once the session has started.
- Just before the session starts, you must put your belongings in the front of the class.
- Random learners will be checked for anything that might deem irregular.
- If you feel more comfortable, you may wear your tracksuit.
- Phones must be switched off and in your bag.
- Wrist watches must be placed in your bag.



If you cheat:

- invigilator must write "cheating" on current answer sheet and take it away.
- invigilator must issue a new answer booklet or clean writing paper for you to start over.
- you will not be given extra time to complete exam.
- The vice-principal or principal will be notified immediately after the session ends.
- further disciplinary measures will take place.

- if it is possible, it will be written on the day you return to school.

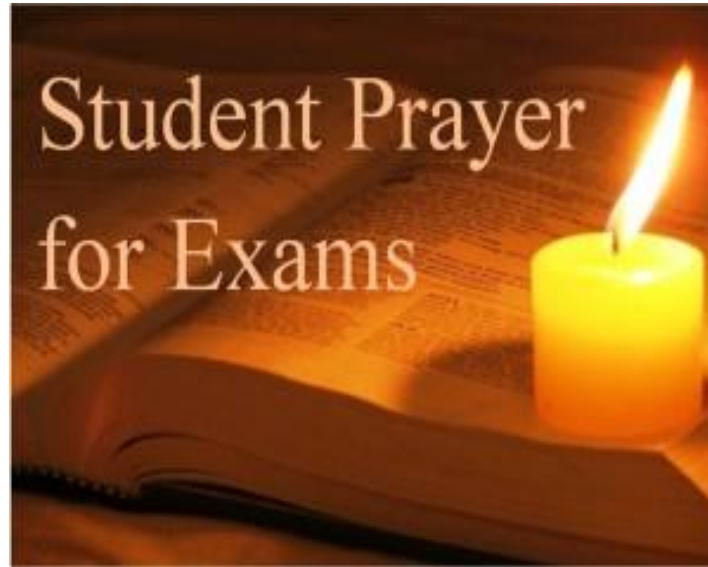

HOW TO PREPARE FOR AN EXAM



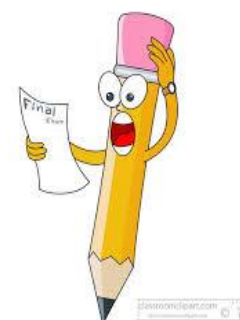

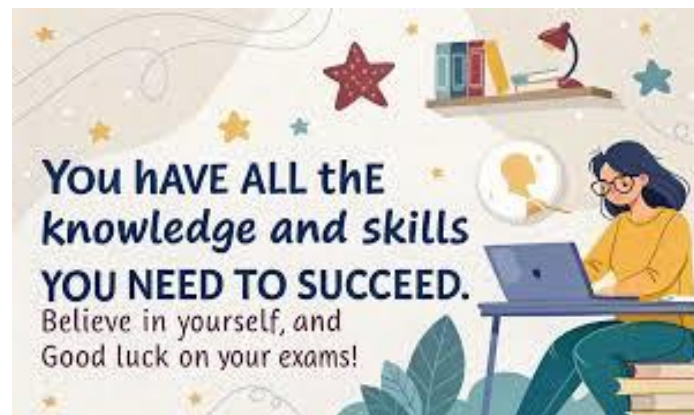
