

From 23 May

- 1. Ensure that you are at school by 7h30.
- 2. After line-up, go immediately to your venue. The session will end at 11h00.
- 3. You may leave immediately after the session. The front gate will close at 12h00.
- 4. If you are still at school by 12h00, you must go to the hall for **STUDY**. Study ends at 14h00.
- 5. If you are still at school by 14h00, you must go to the Visagie Street entrance and wait for your transport there.
- 6. Gr 10 to 12 exam venues: these will be mainly in the hall. It is important that you check on the board closest to the main entrance gate for your name. There you will find venue, row and seat.
- 7. On days that no exam has been scheduled for a specific subject, learners who attend that subject may stay at home. However, if that learner wishes to study at school, venue 16 (Mr Agyepong's classroom) is available.

EXAM RULES

- You must use your own stationery (2 blue pens, 2 HB pencils, eraser, sharpener, stapler, staples and ruler). No bags or pencil cases are allowed. You may use a transparent bag.
- Make sure you have all you need for the subject you are writing e.g. calculator, protractor, etc.
- 3) No tip-ex is allowed.
- 4) Once in the exam venue:
 - you may not talk.
 - you may not eat or drink.
 - you may not walk around.
 - you may not go to the toilet once the session has started.
 - you may not have your cell phone on your person. Please label it with your name and place it in the box on the teacher's desk.
 You can collect it at the end of the session.
 - Just before the session starts, you must put your belongings in the front of the class.
 - Random learners will be checked for anything that might deem irregular.
- 5) If you cheat:
 - invigilator must write "cheating" on current answer sheet and take it away.
 - invigilator must issue a new answer booklet or clean writing paper for you to start over.
 - you will not be given extra time to complete exam.
 - Vice-principal or principal will be notified immediately after the session ends.
 - further disciplinary measures will take place.
- 6) If you are absent:
 - a doctor's letter is essential.
 - if it is possible, it will be written on the day you return to school.

HOW TO PREPARE FOR AN EXAM



- $10\,$ Do your best on the exam and do not put too much undue pressure on yourself to perform. You worked hard to get this far and can only do your best.




